KNOW THE FACTS:

- The safety and protection of children is the most important priority of the Boy Scouts of America.
- Over many years, the BSA has developed some of the strongest expert-informed youth protection policies found in any youth-serving organization including mandatory criminal background checks, required training, mandatory reporting, and two-deep leadership.
- National BSA has filed for Chapter 11 Bankruptcy to achieve two key objectives: equitably compensate victims who were harmed during their time in Scouting and continue to carry out Scouting's mission for years to come. Packs and Troops in Metro-Atlanta, and throughout the U.S., will continue, as will National BSA.
- The entire Scouting community is outraged and saddened there have been instances when individuals participating in the program abused children. The BSA believes victims and supports them.
- The Atlanta Area Council is a separate non-profit corporation. Our programs, camps, and Volunteer
 Service Center are locally owned and will not be affected by the Chapter 11 filing for National BSA. Friends of
 Scouting will continue to be used to pay for day-to-day expenses to provide Scouting in our communities.
- The Atlanta Area Council will continue to deliver a safe and high quality Scouting experience for 31,000 Scouts.
